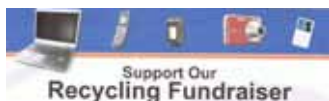
Mary Galloway Welcomes

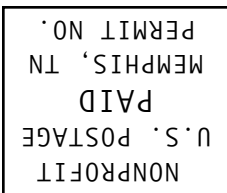
