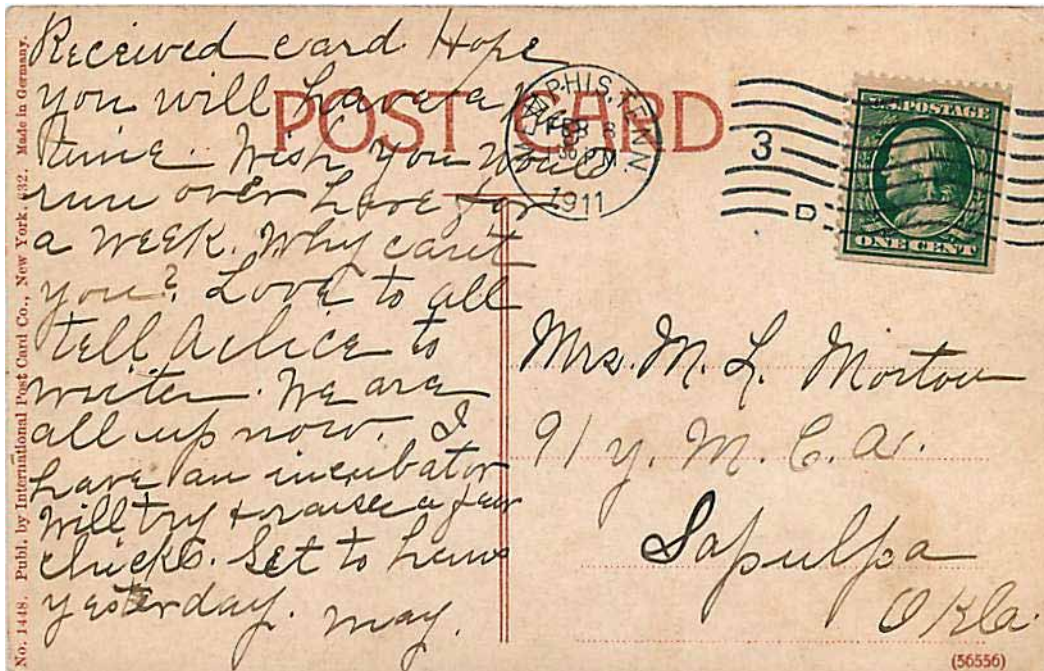
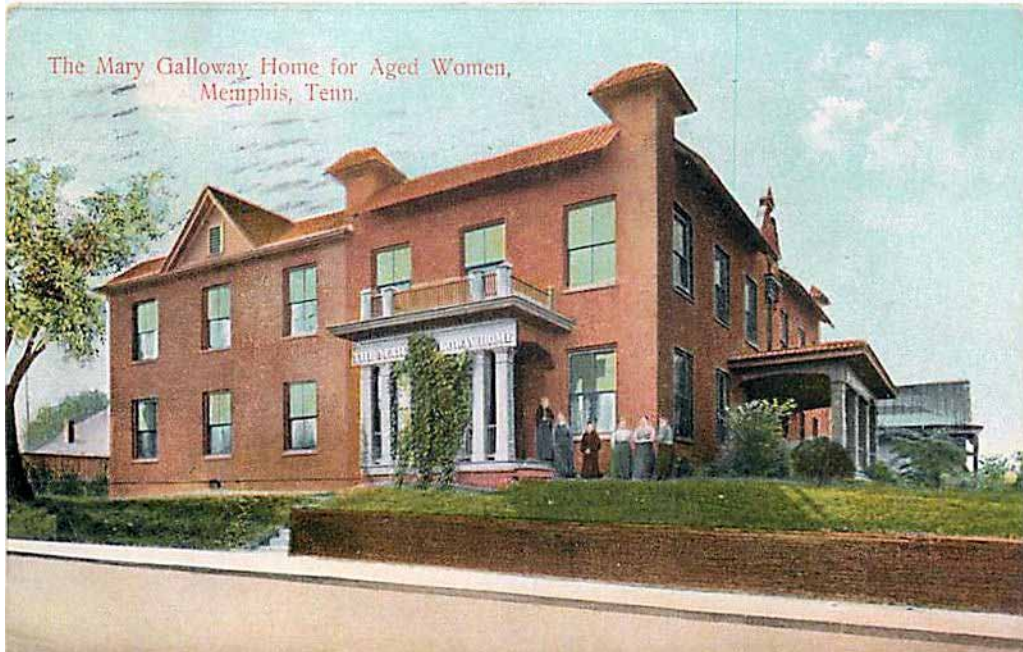

No one had a lot of money, but they darned their stockings and put cardboard in the bottoms of their shoes and made do with what they had. Helen remembers the lessons learned in that time and says she “still values them today.”
